1. A double despair

- ► Jesus came to Jericho 33.AD

▼ Bartimaeus was begging

46 was sitting by the roadside begging.

2. A desperate determination

▼ He shouted in faith

47 When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, "Jesus, Son of David,

- This was a confident shout
- ► This was a crowning shout

▼ He shouted for favor

47 "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"

▼ He shouted with fervency

48 Many rebuked him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"

- ► Hear the callous critics
- ► Hear his continued cries

▼ Jesus stopped and summoned Bartimaeus

49 Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called to the blind man, "Cheer up! On your feet! He's calling you." 50 Throwing his cloak aside, he jumped to his feet and came to Jesus.

- ► Note his royal reception
- ► Note his rapid response

▼ Jesus solicited specifics from Bartimaeus

51 "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked him. The blind man said, "Rabbi, I want to see."

▼ Jesus supplied sight to Bartimaeus

52 "Go," said Jesus, "your faith has healed you." Immediately he received his sight

4. A debtor's devotion

▼ He received a new focus from Jesus

52 Immediately he received his sight

▼ He received a new future as a follower of Jesus

52 Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road.

Messages from the Miracle

- 1. Your troubles in life may be complicated and compounded, but Jesus can bring miracles into the midst of the misery so call out to him!
