2. Eliminate the trash

▲ Eliminate degrading and deflating talk

Ephesians 4:29 Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen.

Eliminate damaging and destructive talk

nes 4:11 Brothers, do not slander one another.

Eliminate divisive and discordant talk

Proverbs 15:1 A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger. -- 16:28 A perverse man stirs up dissension, and a gossip separates close friends. - 21:19 Better to live in a desert than with a quarrelsome and ill-tempered wife.

Philippians 2:14 Do everything without complaining or arguing,

Eliminate dirty and defiling talk

Ephesians 5:3 these are improper for God's holy people. 4 Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place,

Colossians 3:8 But now you must rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips.

▲ Eliminate deceptive and duplicitous talk

Ephesians 4:25 Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor, for we are all members of one body.

3. Elevate the talk...and the typing and texting

Slow up the speaking

James 1:19 My dear brothers, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry,

Surrender to the Spirit and stay sanctified

1 Thessalonians 5:11 Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.

Proverbs 12:18 Reckless words pierce like a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

Proverbs 25:11 A word aptly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver.

Sermonizers, speak strongly and straightly but sweetly
