

Lesson 13: Israel and the Gentiles, Part 2 Romans 10:1-21

Romans 10:1-21

10:1 Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved. 2 For I can testify about them that they are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge. 3 Since they did not know the righteousness that comes from God and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. 4 Christ is the end of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

10:5 Moses describes in this way the righteousness that is by the law: "The man who does these things will live by them." 6 But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?"" (that is, to bring Christ down) 7 "or 'Who will descend into the deep?"" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). 8 But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the word of faith we are proclaiming: 9 That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. 11 As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame." 12 For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile-the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, 13 for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." 30:11-14; Isaiah 28:16; Joel 2:32]

10:14 How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? 15 And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

10:16 But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?" 17 Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ. 18 But I ask: Did they not hear? Of course they did: "Their voice has gone out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world." [Isaiah 53:1; Psaim 19:4]

19 Again I ask: Did Israel not understand? First, Moses says, "I will make you envious by those who are not a nation; I will make you angry by a nation that has no understanding."

[Deuteronomy 32:21]

20 And Isaiah boldly says, "I was found by those who did not seek me; I revealed myself to those who did not ask for me." 21 But concerning Israel he says, "All day long I have held out my hands to a disobedient and obstinate people." [Isaiah 65:1-2]

God's people and their stubborn resistance

▲ Note the spiritual status of the unbelieving Israelites

Romans 10:1 Brothers, my heart's desire and prayer to God for the Israelites is that they may be saved.

▲ Note the stubbornness of the unbelieving Israelites

▼ They are really religious

Romans 10:2 For I can testify about them that they are zealous for God, but their zeal is not based on knowledge.

▼ They are resistant to real righteousness

Romans 10:3 Since they did not know the righteousness that comes from God and sought to establish their own, they did not submit to God's righteousness. 4 Christ is the end of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

God's plan of salvation reexplained

▲ Righteousness can't come by the Jewish law

▼ Christ is the end of the law

Romans 10:4 Christ is the end of the law so that there may be righteousness for everyone who believes.

▼ Christ is the emancipation from the law

Romans 10:5 Moses describes in this way the righteousness that is by the law: "The man who does these things will live by them." 6 But the righteousness that is by faith

▲ Righteousness comes by the Lord Jesus

▼ The gospel is not distant and difficult

Romans 10:6 But the righteousness that is by faith says: "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?"" (that is, to bring Christ down) 7 "or 'Who will descend into the deep?"" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead).

▼ The gospel is now close and clear

Romans 10:8 But what does it say? "The word is near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart," that is, the word of faith we are proclaiming: 9 That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved.

Deuteronomy 30:11 Now what I am commanding you today is not too difficult for you or beyond your reach. 12 It is not up in heaven, so that you have to ask, "Who will ascend into heaven to get it and proclaim it to us so we may obey it?" 13 Nor is it beyond the sea, so that you have to ask, "Who will cross the sea to get it and proclaim it to us so we may obey it?" 14 No, the word is very near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart so you may obey it. 15 See, I set before you today life and prosperity, death and destruction. 16 For I command you today to love the LORD your God, to walk in his ways, and to keep his commands, decrees and laws; then you will live and increase, and the LORD your God will bless you in the land you are entering to possess.

- ► Note the proximity of the gospel near you
- ▶ Note the prescription in the gospel confess with your mouth believe in your heart
- ► Note the power of the gospel you will be saved

▼ The gospel is now everywhere for everyone

Romans 10:11 As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame." 12 For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile—the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him, 13 for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

God's preachers and their success rate

▲ Going with the gospel

▼Preaching is necessary

Romans 10:14 How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them?

▼ Preachers are necessary

Romans 10:15 And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"

▲ Rejected by religious rebels

▼ They were hardhearted and contrary

Romans 10:16 But not all the Israelites accepted the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our message?"

▼ Though they were hearing and comprehending

Romans 10:17 Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word of Christ. 18 But I ask: Did they not hear? Of course they did: "Their voice has gone out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world." 19 Again I ask: Did Israel not understand? First, Moses says, "I will make you envious by those who are not a nation; I will make you angry by a nation that has no understanding."

▲ Welcomed by the world

▼ The Gentiles believed the good news

Romans 10:20 And Isaiah boldly says, "I was found by those who did not seek me; I revealed myself to those who did not ask for me"

▼ The Jews balked at the good news

Romans 10:21 But concerning Israel he says, "All day long I have held out my hands to a disobedient and obstinate people."

▲ Israel is invited

Romans 11:1 I ask then: Did God reject his people? By no means! I am an Israelite myself, a descendant of Abraham, from the tribe of Benjamin. 2 God did not reject his people, whom he foreknew.
