

John 5 (8 June 26AD)

John 4:46 Once more he visited Cana in Galilee, where he had turned the water into wine. And there was a certain royal official whose son lay sick at Capernaum. 47 When this man heard that Jesus had arrived in Galilee from Judea, he went to him and begged him to come and heal his son, who was close to death. 48 "Unless you people see signs and wonders," Jesus told him, "you will never believe." 49 The royal official said, "Sir, come down before my child dies." 50 "Go," Jesus replied, "your son will live." The man took Jesus at his word and departed. 51 While he was still on the way, his servants met him with the news that his boy was living. 52 When he inquired as to the time when his son got better, they said to him, "Yesterday, at one in the afternoon, the fever left him." 53 Then the father realized that this was the exact time at which Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." So he and his whole household believed. 54 This was the second sign Jesus performed after coming from Judea to Galilee.

John 5:1 Some time later, Jesus went up to Jerusalem for one of the Jewish festivals. 2 Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. 3 Here a great number of disabled people used to lie—the blind, the lame, the paralyzed—and they waited for the moving of the waters. 4 From time to time an angel of the Lord would come down and stir up the waters. The first one into the pool after each such disturbance would be cured of whatever disease they had. 5 One who was there had

been an invalid for thirty-eight years. 6 When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, "Do you want to get well?" 7 "Sir," the invalid replied, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me." 8 Then Jesus said to him, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk." 9 At once the man was cured; he picked up his mat and walked. The day on which this took place was a Sabbath, 10 and so the Jewish leaders said to the man who

had been healed, "It is the Sabbath; the law forbids you to carry your mat."

11 But he replied, "The man who made me well said to me, 'Pick up your mat and walk.' " 12 So they asked him, "Who is this fellow who told you to pick it up and walk?" 13 The man who was healed had no idea who it was, for Jesus had slipped away into the crowd that was there.

14 Later Jesus found him at the temple and said to him, "See, you are well again. Stop sinning or something worse may happen to you." 15 The man went away and told the Jewish leaders that it was Jesus who had made him well.

16 So, because Jesus was doing these things on the Sabbath, the Jewish leaders began to persecute him. 17 In his defense Jesus said to them, "My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working." 18 For this reason they tried all the more to kill him; not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God

19 Jesus gave them this answer: "Very truly I tell you, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does. 20 For the Father loves the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, and he will show him even greater works than these, so that you will be amazed. 21 For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son gives life to whom he is pleased to give it. 22 Moreover, the Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son, 23 that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him.

24 "Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life. 25 Very truly I tell you, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live. 26 For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son also to have life in himself. 27 And he has given him authority to judge because he is the Son of Man.

28 "Do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice 29 and come out—those who have done what is good will rise to live, and those who have done what is evil will rise to be condemned. 30 By myself I can do nothing; I judge only as I hear, and my judgment is just, for I seek not to please myself but him who sent me.

31 "If I testify about myself, my testimony is not true. 32 There is another who testifies in my favor, and I know that his testimony about me is true

33 "You have sent to John and he has testified to the truth. 34 Not that I accept human testimony; but I mention it that you may be saved. 35 John was a lamp that burned and gave light, and you chose for a time to enjoy his light.

36 "I have testimony weightier than that of John. For the works that the Father has given me to finish—the very works that I am doing—testify that the Father has sent me. 37 And the Father who sent me has himself testified concerning me. You have never heard his voice nor seen his form, 38 nor does his word dwell in you, for you do not believe the one he sent. 39 You study the Scriptures diligently because you think that in them you have eternal life. These are the very Scriptures that testify about me, 40 yet you refuse to come to me to have life.

41 "I do not accept glory from human beings, 42 but I know you. I know that you do not have the love of God in your hearts. 43 I have come in my Father's name, and you do not accept me; but if someone else comes in his own name, you will accept him. 44 How can you believe since you accept glory from one another but do not seek the glory that comes from the only God?

45 "But do not think I will accuse you before the Father. Your accuser is Moses, on whom your hopes are set. 46 If you believed Moses, you would believe me, for he wrote about me. 47 But since

lesus Saves a Gentile Official

And there was a certain royal official whose son lay sick at Capernaum (15 miles away). 47 When this man heard that Jesus had arrived in Galilee from Judea, he went to him and begged him to come and heal his son, who was close to death. 48 "Unless you people see signs and wonders," Jesus told him, "you will never believe." 49 The royal official said, "Sir, come down before my child dies." (The official was a Gentile who should know better than to ask a Jew to break Jewish laws by entering his house but whose motive was concern) 50 "Go," Jesus replied, "your son will live." (There is power in Jesus' words - more than the rulers faith) The man took Jesus at his word and departed. (His action follows his faith) 51 While he was still on the way, his servants met him with the news that his boy was living. 52 When he inquired as to the time when his son got better, they said to him, "Yesterday, at one in the afternoon, the fever left him." 53 Then the father realized that this was the exact time at which Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." So he and his whole household believed. 54 This was the second sign Jesus performed after coming from Judea to Galilee. (Because of the sign it became solidified faith.)

Jesus Heals at the Pool of Bethesda

John 5:1 Some time later, (Saturday 8 June 26AD) Jesus went up to Jerusalem for one of the Jewish festivals. (The day before Pentecost) 2 Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. 3 Here a great number of disabled people used to lie—the blind, the lame, the paralyzed —and they waited for the moving of the waters. 4 From time to time an angel of the Lord would come down and stir up the waters. The first one into the pool after each such disturbance would be cured of whatever disease they had. (Verse 4 is in the Diatessaron of 150AD. NIV says "Some less important manuscripts") 5 One who was there had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. 6 When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, "Do you want to get well?"

Exodus 15:26 He said, "If you listen carefully to the LORD your God and do what is right in his eyes, if you pay attention to his commands and keep all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for I am the LORD, who heals you."

7 "Sir," the invalid replied, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me."

8 Then Jesus said to him, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk."

9 At once the man was cured; he picked up his mat and walked. The day on which this took place was a Sabbath, 10 and so the Jewish leaders said to the man who had been healed, "It is the Sabbath; the law forbids you to carry your mat." (Their interpretation of the law)

- 11 But he replied, "The man who made me well said to me, 'Pick up your mat and walk.'"
- 12 So they asked him, "Who is this fellow who told you to pick it up and walk?"
- 13 The man who was healed had no idea who it was, (Jesus works in the lives of people even when they do not know who he is!) for Jesus had slipped away into the crowd that was there.
- 14 Later Jesus found him at the temple and said to him, "See, you are well again. **Stop sinning or something worse may happen to you."** 15 The man went away and told the Jewish leaders that it was Jesus who had made him well.
- 16 So, because Jesus was doing these things on the **Sabbath**, the Jewish leaders began to persecute him. 17 In his defense Jesus said to them, "My **Father** is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working." (What about God's day of rest? Not a do nothing rest) 18 For this reason they tried all the more to kill him; not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God. (Equality with God is blasphemous unless you are God.)
- 19 Jesus gave them this answer: "Very truly I tell you, the Son can do nothing by himself; (Jesus worked in the power of the Holy Spirit of God not His own) he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does. 20 For the Father loves the Son and shows him all he does. Yes, and he will show him even greater works than these, so that you will be amazed. 21 For just as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, even so the Son gives life to whom he is pleased to give it. 22 Moreover, the Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son, 23 that all may honor the Son just as they honor the Father. (Jesus will be honored) Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father, who sent him.
- 24 "Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life (Has eternal life NOW! and will escape from paradise in Hades) and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life. 25 Very truly I tell you, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live. 26 For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son also to have life in himself. 27 And he has given him authority to judge because he is the Son of Man. (Authority because he is a man. He has been there and knows the trial and the victory and the reality.)
- 28 "Do not be amazed at this, for a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice 29 and come out—those who have **done** what is good will rise to live, and those who have **done** what is evil will rise to be condemned. (Eternal Reward or Punishment is by works which are a result of our beliefs) 30 By myself I can do nothing; I judge only as I hear, and my judgment is just, for I seek not to please myself but him who sent me. (Christ pleases God the Father.)
- 31 "If I testify about myself, my testimony is not true. 32 There is another who testifies in my favor, and I know that **his** testimony about me is true. (Any one can say anything but can you back it up?)
- 33 "You have sent to **John** and he has testified to the truth. 34 Not that I accept **human** testimony; **(Anyone can say anything about someone else but how do we know it's truth?)** but I mention it that you may be saved. 35 **John** was a lamp that burned and gave light, **(John was a credible witness)** and you chose for a time to enjoy his light.
- 36 "I have testimony weightier than that of John. For the works that the Father has given me to finish—the very works that I am doing—testify that the Father has sent me. (Watch the fruit/works. Does he love?) 37 And the Father who sent me has himself testified concerning me. You have never heard his voice nor seen his form, (Unbelief causes Dull ears and Dull eyes) 38 nor does his word dwell in you, (They cannot see the kingdom of God) for you do not believe the one he sent. (They reject His word and Spirit) 39 You study the Scriptures diligently because you think (The scriptures are good, but if you do not believe them, accept them, live by them, it does no good) that in them you have eternal life. These are the very Scriptures that testify about me, 40 yet you refuse to come to me to have life. (Life is foreign to them.)
- **Isaiah 6:9** He said, "Go and tell this people: " 'Be ever hearing, but never understanding; be ever seeing, but never perceiving.' 10 Make the heart of this people calloused; make their ears dull and close their eyes. Otherwise they might see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their hearts, and turn and be healed."
- 41 "I do not accept glory from human beings, (Men are fickle) 42 but I know you. I know that you do not have the love of God (Love of God is all important) in your hearts. 43 I have come in my Father's name, (Jehovah saves) and you do not accept me; but if someone else comes in his own name, (Jesus came in His Father's loving character, and the anti-Christ will come in the character of man, the 666) you will accept him. 44 How can you believe since you accept glory from one another but do not seek the glory that comes from the only God?
- 45 "But do not think I will accuse you before the Father. Your accuser is **Moses**, on whom your hopes are set. 46 **If you believed Moses**, you would believe me, for he wrote about me. (The very scriptures will be used to condemn them) 47 But since you do not believe what he wrote, how are you going to believe what I say?" (If you can't believe the Bible, you will not believe the Spirit speaking to you today, and you may be deceived by the false prophets speaking today.)
- Saturday 22 June 26AD Mark 2:26 In the days of Abiathar the high priest, he entered the house of God and ate the consecrated bread, which is lawful only for priests to eat. And he gave some to his companions."... 28 So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."
- **1Kings 2:26 To Abiathar the priest** the king said, "Go back to your fields in Anathoth. You deserve to die, but I will not put you to death now, because you carried the ark of the Sovereign LORD before my father David and shared all my father's hardships." **27 So Solomon removed Abiathar from the priesthood** of the LORD, fulfilling the word the LORD had spoken at Shiloh about the house of Eli.
- Wednesday 3 July 26AD Matthew 9:27 As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed him, calling out, "Have mercy on us, Son of David!"
- **Mark 10:46** Then they came to Jericho. As Jesus and his disciples, together with a large crowd, were leaving the city, **a blind man, Bartimaeus** (which means "son of Timaeus"), was sitting by the roadside begging. 47 When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, "Jesus, **Son of David, have mercy on me!**"
- **Psalm 19:7** The **law of the LORD** is perfect, converting the soul: the **testimony** of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple.
- 8 The **statutes** of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart; the **commandment** of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes.
- 9 The fear of the LORD is clean, enduring for ever: the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether.
- 10 More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb.
- 11 Moreover by them is thy servant **warned**: and in **keeping** of them there is great reward.
